



Public Law Fellowship 2020

Renne Public Law Group is pleased to offer a condensed fellowship program designed to introduce law students to local government advocacy.

The Fellowship Program will be held remotely for a two-week period: June 8-19, 2020. Fellows will receive a \$2,000 stipend at the conclusion of the program. The deadline for applications is May 18, 2020 by 4 pm PST.

The Program is designed to be a “crash course” – immersing students in the field of local government law and initiatives. Fellows will gain valuable knowledge in a wide range of law and legal issues unique to local government, including the Brown Act, the Public Records Act, CEQA, the Meyers-Millias-Brown Act, charter law principles and more. The program will include talks with local officials and legal experts, legal research assignments, and discussions about future challenges facing local governments. The program is intended to supplement summer programs at private law firms and government agencies, especially those that have been delayed, deferred or cancelled.

To be eligible, students: must have completed their first year of law school but ideally have completed their second year; must demonstrate a serious interest in the local public sector; must have an excellent academic background and possess superior writing skills. Students must commit to spending at least 30 hours a week on the Fellowship.
