KC also served as a legal research attorney for the Law and Motion division of the San Francisco Superior Court, where he analyzed complex record materials and drafted over 100 judicial orders on preliminary injunctions, summary judgment motions, demurrers and administrative writs.

Earlier in his career, KC served as a David B. Bryson Memorial fellow at the National Housing Law Project, drafted dispositive motions for the California Department of Justice's Government Law Section and handled housing policy litigation. He actively serves the public interest as a mayor-appointed commissioner on the San Francisco Residential Rent Stabilization and Arbitration Board and as a California State Bar appointed commissioner to the Commission on Judicial Nominees Evaluation.
